

#### **OREGON FFA CONVENTION**

Grange Co-op attended the Oregon FFA State Convention in Redmond Oregon. Visiting FFA members from across Oregon provided reassurance in the future of agriculture. The young men and women in the blue corduroy jackets have respect, knowledge, and a passion for the agriculture industry that Grange Co-op is proud to support.

#### YUBA SUTTER FARM DAYS

Yuba Sutter Farm Bureaus Farm Day! This is an annual event intended to educate youth about all facets of agriculture. Over 200 local third-grade students, teachers, and parents, visited our booth to learn more about our Youth in Ag Program.

Students who visited Grange Co-op's booth learned about proper animal care, and what supplies would be needed to raise an animal for their local county fair. We were blown away by the agricultural knowledge youth across Yuba Sutter counties have. Many students who visited the booth have helped their families on their farms while others were eager to learn about what it takes to care for livestock.







#### YUBA CITY SHOW CLINIC

Purina and Grange Co-op joined forces this year to provide youth in Yuba City California with an opportunity to refine their showmanship skills. With over 400 individuals in attendance the barns were full as local 4-H and FFA members heard from animal experts and showmanship champions on how to be your best in and out of the ring. Grange Co-op and Purina provided youth in agriculture with the necessary information they will carry to their local fairs as they show their livestock.

#### **BLUE CORDUROY CLASSIC**

Grange Co-op is committed to supporting youth in agriculture. In 2022 one of the ways support was shown was during California FFA's Blue Corduroy Classic. This virtual fundraiser raised over \$25,000 for California FFA members. Funds raised will allow students to participate in more FFA opportunities and become more invested in the agricultural communities surrounding them.









#### **COUNTY FAIRS**

Grange Co-op attended county fairs across southern Oregon and northern California. 4-H and FFA members worked day and night to perfect their market projects, ranging from cattle, swine, goats, lambs, poultry, and Ag Mechanic projects. Students have spent the past year waking up before the sun to ensure their projects were ready for their county fair. Grange Co-op is always proud to support the youth in our communities who invest in agricultural experiences.



#### **JACKSON COUNTY HARVEST FAIR**

Grange Co-op was a proud sponsor of the 2022 Jackson County Harvest Fair. This is an annual event that hosts breeders and buyers from across the West Coast as they look for their perfect Steer or Heifer project for the upcoming fair season. 4-H and FFA members purchased their club calf projects and Grange Co-op were happy to provide a FREE bag of Rogue Feed with every purchase. The demanding work and dedication the breeders put into their steers and heifers was amazing to see.



## FIRE RELIEF FOR SISKIYOU COUNTY FAIR

The West Coast is no stranger to wildfires. In 2022, due to the effects and devastation from the McKinney Fire near Yreka, CA, the Southern Oregon community took immediate action and banded together to host the Siskiyou County Fair at the Jackson County Expo. In an effort to provide the resources needed, Grange Co-op assisted by coordinating and transporting livestock panels from the Siskiyou County Fairgrounds to the Jackson County Expo. These panels created the livestock show arena, allowing exhibitors to safely show and auction their projects.

The Siskiyou County livestock exhibitors who, despite the unexpected circumstances, traveled from afar to finish and show their project with pride. The determination shown is a true testament to the perseverance these students have. Each one did an excellent job working through unforeseen changes and roadblocks to attend their auction. We are honored to have purchased 7 project animals from these exhibitors! We look forward to providing continued support to our youth in agriculture in the years to come.







#### **CHICK DAYS**

Grange Co-op encouraged customers to increase their involvement in agriculture during its annual Chick Days. With a purchase of a 40 or 50 lb bag of chick feed customers were provided 5 free chicks. In 2022, this event provided 3,700 free chicks!

#### **ARBOR DAY**

Each year, in honor of Arbor Day, Grange Co-op gives free tree saplings out to our customers. This year Grange Co-op gave out over 1,500 saplings in nine varieties. Customers visited any of the seven Grange Co-op retail stores to score a free tree of their own.



#### **PLANTING DAY**

Saturday, April 16th, Grange Co-op, along with the Rogue Gardener Stan Mapolski, hosted the annual Planting Day event.
Customers and community members came together at all seven retail locations to plant flowers in various sizes of flowerpots right before Easter.

Participants were encouraged to spend some, save some for the future and share some with a local non-profit of their choice. There were 42 stands throughout Grants Pass, giving around 200 kids the opportunity to operate their own business. We enjoyed having these kids bring some fun to our parking lot while they used the space to learn important life skills.
